


You may love these stars' talents, but did you know they can also write too?

Picture Books




[The Very Fairy Princess series](#) by Julie Andrews (*Picture Book AND*)

Despite her scabby knees and dirty fingernails, Geraldine knows that she is a princess inside and shows it through her behavior at home and in school.




[The Jolly Mon](#) by Jimmy Buffett (*available to interloan*)

This book relates the adventures of a fisherman who finds a magic guitar floating in the Caribbean Sea. It also includes the music for the song "Jolly Mon Sing."




[Read All About It](#) by Laura Welch Bush and Jenna Bush (*Picture Book BUS*)

Tyrone and his friends rule the school except for the library, which he thinks is boring until strange happenings during story hour change his mind.




[How Roland Rolls](#) by Jim Carrey (*available to interloan*)


[River Rose and the Magical Lullaby](#) by Kelly Clarkson (*available to interloan*)

When River Rose is unable to fall asleep, her mother sings her a lullaby that spins a magical dream of a special day at the zoo with animal friends.




[A Suitcase Surprise For Mommy](#) by Cat Cora (*Picture Book COR*)

When Carrie is disappointed not to make the school soccer team, she turns her attention to creating a science fair project.




[I Already Know I Love You](#) by Billy Crystal (*Picture Book CRY*)

A grandfather dreams of all the things he will do with his new grandchild.




[The Adventures of Honey and Leon](#) by Alan Cumming (*Picture Book CUM*)

Determined to keep their dads safe on their trip to France, two dogs disguise themselves and follow along.




[I'm Gonna Like Me: Letting Off a Little Self-Esteem](#) by Jamie Lee Curtis (*Picture Book CUR*)

A child's emotions range from silliness to anger to excitement, coloring and changing each day.




[Take Heart My Child](#) by Ainsley Earhardt (*available to interloan*)

An unnamed mother shares life lessons with her newborn child, encouraging them to follow their hopes and dreams and to not lose heart during challenging times.




[Snowball Fight](#) by Jimmy Fallon (*Picture Book FAL*)

A series of animal fathers try to teach their young to say "Dada". (*Also available as a Board Book*)




[Let George Do It](#) by George Foreman (*Picture Book FOR*)

Five brothers named George, along with Mrs. George, get ready for Big George's birthday party.




[Cookie Meets Peanut](#) by Bethany Frankel (*Picture Book FRA*)

The musical prodigy Farkle McBride tries a number of instruments before discovering that conducting the orchestra makes him happy.




[Mario and Baby Gia](#) by Mario Lopez (*Picture Book LOP*)


[The Alphabet From A to Y With Bonus Letter, Z!](#) by Steve Martin (*Picture Book MAR*)


[Freckleface Strawberry series](#) by Julianne Moore (*Picture Book MOO*)


[Finding Susie](#) by Sandra Day O'Connor (*Picture Book OCO*)

On a ranch in the American Southwest, Sandra longs for a pet but each time she tries to adopt a wild animal, she concludes that it will be better off where it belongs.




[Give Please a Chance](#) by Bill O'Reilly and James Patterson (*Picture Book ORE*)


[Goodnight Numbers](#) by Danica McKellar (*Picture Book MCK*)

Illustrations and simple text help the reader understand the numbers one to ten and recognize them as they appear all around us, especially at bedtime. Includes note to parents.




[I am a Rainbow](#) by Dolly Parton (*Picture Book PAR*)

A girl tells what it is like living with her twin brother who has autism and sometimes finds it hard to communicate with words, but who, in most ways, is just like any other boy. Includes authors' note about autism.




[Out of the Ballpark](#) by Alex Rodriguez (*Picture Book ROD*)

Although Alex is nervous about his role in the approaching baseball playoffs and championship game, he soon figures out how to fix his mistakes and become a better player.




[Halloween](#) by Jerry Seinfeld (*Picture Book (Halloween) SEI*)

[Dream Big Little Pig](#) by Kristy Yamaguchi (*available to interloan*)



A self-confident young African-American girl explains why she is "queen of the scene" at the playground.




[If Roast Beef Could Fly](#) by Jay Leno (*Picture Book (CD) LEN*)

[How to Train With a T. Rex and Win 8 Gold Medals](#) by Michael Phelps (*Picture Book (Older) PHE*)



[Hank Zipzer series](#) by Henry Winkler (*J PB Hank Zipzer*)



[Sugar Plum Ballerinas series](#) by Whoopi Goldberg (*J PB Sugar Plum Ballerinas*)


Learn about the girls from The Nutcracker School of Ballet as they work through stage fright, moving, overcoming hardships and more in this fun series!

Fiction




[Red Zone](#) by Tiki and Ronde Barber (*J BAR*)


[Wild Card](#) by Tiki and Ronde Barber (*J BAR*)


[The Contract](#) by Derek Jeter (*J JET*)

Non – Fiction





In two bilingual stories printed back to back, children reflect on how much they resemble their parents.




[Emeril's There's a Chef in My Family: Recipes to Get Everybody Cooking](#) by Emeril Lagasse (641.5 LAG)




[Dirt on My Shirt](#) by Jeff Foxworthy (811 FOX)




[Silly Street](#) by Jeff Foxworthy (811 FOX)
