After dying at age sixteen, Travis Coates' head was removed and frozen for five years before being attached to another body, and now the old Travis must find a new way to coexist.

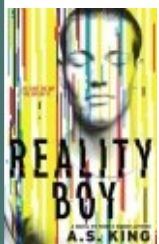

Follows observant "wallflower" Charlie as he charts a course through the strange world between adolescence and adulthood.

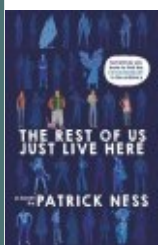

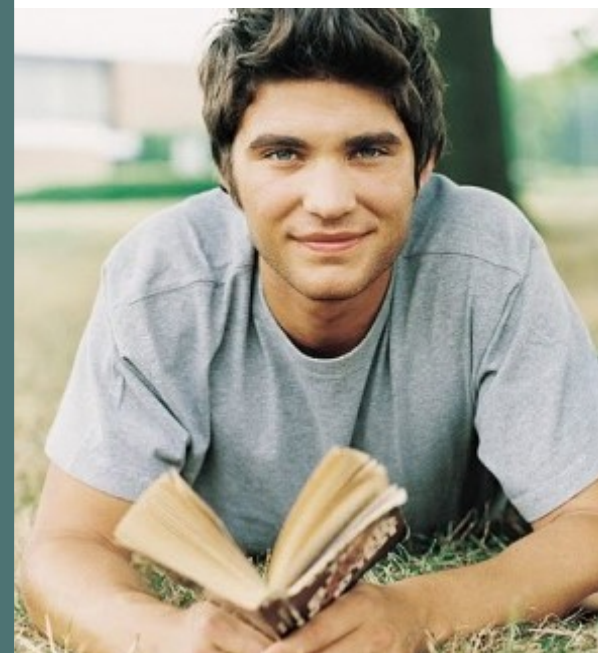

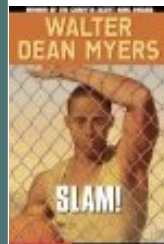
