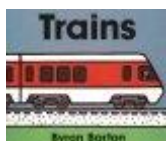

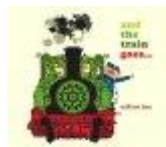
Barton, Byron. [Trains](#)

A shark and a train compete in a series of contests on a seesaw, in hot air balloons, bowling, shooting baskets, playing hide-and-seek, and more. (BAR)



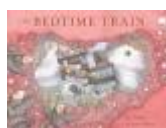
Bee, William. [And the Train Goes—](#)

Brief text and illustrations trace the journey of a colorful train as it goes through tunnels, by cities, and over trestles. (CRE)



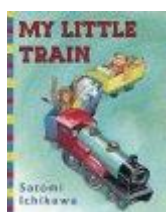
Eaton, Jason Carter. [How to Train a Train](#)

Learn what it was like to travel on the transcontinental railroad in the 1860s. (FLO)



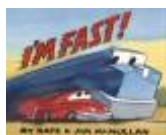
Ichikawa, Satomi. [My Little Train](#)

A little train goes for a ride, taking all the stuffed animals where they want to go. (ICH)



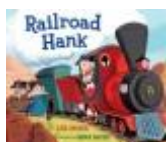
Lewis, Kevin. [Chugga-Chugga Choo-Choo](#)

A rhyming story about a freight train's day, from loading freight in the morning to retiring to the roundhouse after the day's work is done. (LEW)



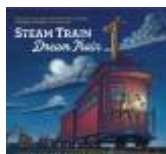
McMullan, Kate & Jim. [I'm Fast](#)

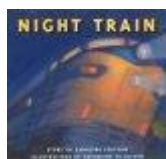
Rinker, Sherri Duskey. [Steam Train, Dream Train](#)

In this book with rhyming text, the dream train pulls into the station and all the different cars are loaded by the animal workers, each with the appropriate cargo (RIN)



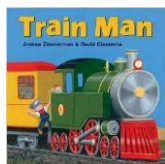
Sobel, June. [The Goodnight Train](#).

Stutson, Caroline. [Night Train](#).

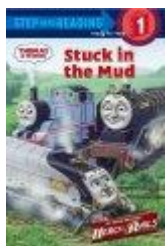

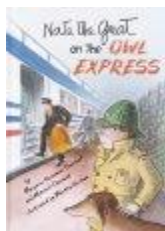
Lewman, David. [The Great Train Mystery](#)

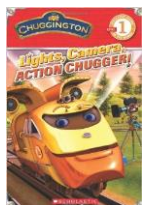
Parker, Marjorie Blain. [Hello, Freight Train!](#)

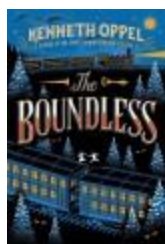
Barnett, Mac. [It Happened on a Train](#)

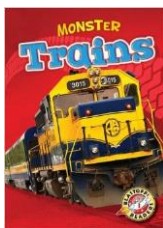

Developed by literacy experts for students in kindergarten through grade three, this book introduces extreme trains to young readers through leveled text and related photos (J625.1 GOR)



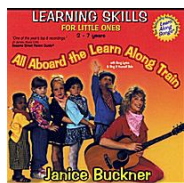
National Railway Museum. [Big Book of Trains](#)

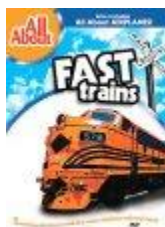

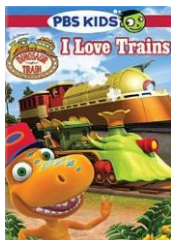

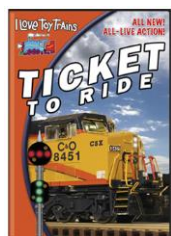
